Black Cherry	I	OP	70	Heirloom cherry tomato with a rich mahogany-purple color and sweetly complex flavor. Round 1" fruit, very productive.
Candyland Red	I	F1	55-60d	AAS award winner. ½ inch round, red, exploding with rich, concentrated currant flavor.
Gold Nugget	I	OP	60	An early, prolific, deep golden yellow cherry tomato. Developed at Oregon State University for the cool climate of the PNW.
Indigo Cherry Drops	I	OP	71	Non-GMO loaded with the high antioxidant levels that. 1–1 ¼ inches across, deep, rosy-red, heavy producer, PVPAF.
Micro Tom	D	F1	53d	Very compact, only 8" tall, these plants produce continuous crops of tasty 1-3" red tomatoes.
Midnight Snack	I	F1	70	2017 AAS Edible-Vegetable Winner. A unique indigo-type cherry tomato that ripens to red with a beautiful glossy black-purple overlay when exposed to sunlight. High in anthocyanins.
Sun Gold	I	F1	65d	fruity sweet or tropical flavor, bright apricot-orange round globes are about 1" across and are borne on long, 10–15 fruit, grape-like trusses. The vigorous indeterminate vines produce equally well in the field and the early spring greenhouse. F 1–2, TMV, V.

Sun Sugar	I	F1	62d	A hybrid orange cherry tomato with unbelievably good flavor and productivity. crack resistance bred in while still keeping a thin skin.
Super Sweet 100	I	F1	60d	Reliable red cherry with prolific yields of great-tasting, ½ - ¾ oz. fruits produced in large clusters. High Resistance: Fusarium and Verticillium Wilt .
Sweet Gold Cherry	I	F1	65 d	Sweet Gold has both full, sweet tomato flavor and glossy 1” jewel toned golden yellow fruits.
Sweet Million	I	F1	65-75d	1–1 ½ inch fruit in grape-like clusters. Red, Great flavor. High Resistance to F 1–2, TMV, ToMV 0–1.
Uralskiy Ranniy	D	OP	50d	Unique, super early dwarf plants are very well-suited for container culture. Red, 2-4 oz, mini-beefsteak shaped fruit are juicy with good flavor. A Russian commercial variety, when translated means “Early from Ural.”
Valentine	D	F1	55 d	Delicious high-lycopene grape tomato. Massive early yields, deep-red color, and unusually rich flavor. Long shelf life. AAS winner. NOTE: For best flavor, harvest when fruits are deep red.
Washington Cherry	D	OP	60d	First-early determinate deep-red cherry tomato. High-yielding, compact plants. Globe-shaped, 1oz, 20–25 gm thick-walled, meaty, and flavorful, with good keeping quality. Developed by Washington State University.
White Cherry	Semi-I	OP	59	Pale yellow fruits, have a good, mild taste. Plants are compact and easy to pick but should be caged or staked.
Juliet	I	F1	60d	Great flavor, fresh or cooked. Deep red, shiny fruits, productive, typically 12–18 fruits per cluster. Delicious, rich tomato flavor for salads, great salsa, and fresh pasta sauce. Good crack

				resistance, vine storage, and shelf life. AAS winner. Indeterminate. Disease Resistance: Early Blight (Intermediate), Late Blight (Intermediate)
Pandorino, Italian Grape	I	F1	70-75d.	Pandorino's vigorous, tall vines are covered early with multiple cascading clusters of cherry-bright, sweet fruits to harvest all summer long. a wonderful full tomato flavor that's nicely balanced and not just sticky sweet. Extremely disease-resistant and widely adapted.
Supernova Grape	I	OP	63 d	A luminous red, tiny Roma-like tomato with yellow streaks inside and out! This tomato is the perfect snacking companion for its delightful flavor and compact size.
Yellow Pear Heirloom	I	OP	75-80 d	Very old tomato that dates to at least the early 1600's. 1-2 inch, pear-shaped, lemon to golden yellow fruits throughout the season. This variety was used by early Americans more for preserving and pickling. Yellow pear tomatoes are very popular today for salads.

Amish Paste Heirloom	OP I	80-85d	A longtime favorite heirloom plum. Does well in the PNW. Large, avg. 8-12 oz. with excellent flavor. These meaty tomatoes are good in salads and great for processing.
Midnight Roma	OP Semi-D	80d	A deep purple-red paste tomato packed with phytonutrients. In the kitchen, this purple wonder shines for its quick cook time and memorable flavor. Purple color increases with direct sun; consider plant maintenance to increase exposure. Sale of seed supports public plant breeding research at Oregon State University.
Paisano	F1 D	68d	Thick-walled 4–5 oz. fruits in the true San Marzano shape. Good flavor and high solids for sauce or canning. Concentrated sets of paste tomatoes midseason. Most of the bright red fruits are blunt tipped, so they don't crush during harvesting. Medium determinate plant.
Piennolo del Vesuvio	OP I	65d	This is an Italian heirloom tomato traditionally grown on the hillsides of Mt. Vesuvius. A non-stop producing plant. This is a long keeper tomato with many uses: snacking, salsas, fresh eating, salads, and sauces.
Roma, Bush	OP D	77 d	An excellent heirloom tomato—firm, meaty, 3" oblong fruits with few seeds, on compact vines that are very productive. As a determinate type, most of the fruits ripen at the same time, which makes this tomato a good choice for canning.
San Marzano	OP I	80d	San Marzano is considered one of the best paste tomatoes of all time, with Old World look and taste. Whole 4–6 oz. tomatoes peel easily and cook down quickly.
Sunrise Sauce	F1 D	57d	Low-maintenance orange paste tomato. Much sweeter flavor than others in its class. Sunrise Sauce produces high yields of 4–6 oz. squat, Roma-shaped fruits within a concentrated period, which makes it perfect for saucing. Not to mention it has exceptional fruit quality and flavor and cooks down quickly. The perfect patio bush tomato. Disease Resistance: Fusarium Wilt races 1 (High), Verticillium Wilt (High)

Beaver Lodge 6808	OP	D	55-60d	Early, productive, compact, the plants tend to creep rather than grow tall and would be perfect in a hanging basket or patio container. Has a rich and balanced the flavor Bred at the Beaver Lodge Research Center in Alberta, Canada. 1 ½ inch round fruit.
Better Boy	F1	I	75d	America's most popular hybrid tomato for generations won a Guinness Award for producing 342 lbs. of fruit from only one plant! Fruits weigh about a pound and are juicy but firm. Excellent disease resistance and high adaptability
Big Beef Hybrid	F1	I	73d	AAS award winner, very good disease resistance (F1,2 V TMV, root-knot nematodes, Stemphylium) Productive, large, red, round, beefsteak variety.
Black Krim, Russian Heirloom	OP	I	70-90d	Black Krim combines bold, smoky flavor and good texture with an unusual appearance. Deep brown/red, 8-16 oz. tomatoes have brown/green shoulders that get darker with more heat and sunlight. High-yielding. Indeterminate.
Bobcat	F1	D	68d	Wonderful on burgers, earlier than other beefsteak types. firm, meaty, gloriously red flesh and a classic tomato shape. These impressive 10 oz slicers load heavily on sturdy stems, no caging necessary. F 1-2, L, V.
Burpee's Big Boy	F1	I	78d	When Burpee bred and introduced Big Boy hybrid tomato in 1949, its incredible productivity and perfect, large red fruit made it an instant hit. Wonderful aroma and rich flavor. The fruits weigh at least 10 oz. with many reaching 1 lb. or more.
Celebrity	F1	I	71d	AAS Winner! Firm flesh and very flavorful. Consistent performer and widely adaptable. This early producer is noted for its large, firm fruit.

Cosmonaut Volkov, Russian Heirloom	OP	I	72 d	Abundant 2-3 inch, slightly squat, deep orange/red fruit with green-tinged shoulders, and bright red interiors with a rich, deep, balanced, sweet and tangy flavor. Territorial Seed Company's Great Northwest Tomato Taste-Off winner
Crimson Sprinter	OP	Semi-D	65d	The Crimson Sprinter Tomato is an early ripening tomato named after 'sprinting ice skaters' for their speedy performance in cooler weather. The semi-determinate vines can reach between 3 -5' tall, some staking and pruning is recommended. Plants provide great yields of medium-sized slicer tomatoes, that are brilliant red, ranging 5 - 7 oz each and high in lycopene content.
Early Girl	F1	I	60d	Classic extra-early slicer. Early Girl produces heavy yields of full-flavored, 4-6 oz. tomatoes. Also prized for its performance as a "dry-farmed" tomato, owing to its extreme tolerance to drought and blossom end rot. Disease Resistance: Fusarium Wilt races 1, 2 (High), Verticillium Wilt (High)
Fantastic	F1	I	70-75d	The 3-5 inch, round firm slicers are very solid, and have above average crack resistance . Fantastic's meaty, bright red fruit are rich in beefsteak flavor that makes this a favorite. Very high yielding.
Goliath Giant Early Bush	F1	Semi-D	49d	Large fruit on an early bush tomato plant. 'Giant Early Bush' is a week earlier than 'Early Girl' and as big as 'Big Beef' Has a classic, old fashioned tomato flavor that's both tart and tangy. Ideal for the garden or large pots. Requires support due to the weight of the fruits. Resistant to: Fusarium Wilt (Races 1 & 2), Nematodes, Verticillium Wilt
Green Zebra	OP	I	72-75d (75-80d)	Green Zebra's sweet and zesty flavor is as appetizing as its appearance is spectacular. The 1 ½-2 ½ inch fruit have glowing green skin overlaid with olive and gold mottled streaks. Indeterminate plants just keep producing throughout the season.
Japanese Trifele Black	OP	I	80-85d	Japanese Black Trifele tomato is a unique heirloom tomato variety that originated in Russia. The 3" pear-shaped fruit has green-streaked shoulders, deepening to

				a burnished mahogany and finally to a darkened, nearly black base. This tomato is known for its rich, sweet, and complex flavor with a hint of smokiness. very crack resistant , potato-leaved plants.
Jaune Flamme, French Heirloom	OP	I	75d	The Jaune Flamme tomato is a French heirloom, its name translates to “Yellow Flame,” in reference to the unique color of the fruit, delightful flavor and easy it is to grow in diverse regions.
Legend	OP	D	68d	Legend demonstrates tolerance of late blight and is also one of the earliest maturing slicing tomatoes. Legend produces amazingly sweet tomatoes with just the right amount of acidity. The big, 4–5 inch, parthenocarpic fruit are glossy red, with a uniform round shape. Bred and released by Dr. Jim Baggett at Oregon State University. Determinate. LB.
Momotaro	F1	I	70d	Momotaro is one of the most popular tomato varieties in Japanese markets and for good reason. Its flavor is an intricate and harmonious combination of sweet and tangy. The radiant pink slicers weigh 6–7 ounces. Momotaro is durable, heat tolerant, and crack resistant with good storability. HR: F 1–2, L, N, ToMV, V. IR: B.
Moskvich, Heirloom	OP	I	60-65d	Moskvich Tomato flourishes even in cooler climates. Fruits are early, deep red, globe shaped. 4-6 oz and rich flavor. This heirloom tomato variety was cultivated in the early 1970s in Russia ‘Moskvich’ means “man from Moscow.”
Old Fashioned Goliath (variety ‘Maestro F1’)		I	78dl	Beef hybrid Variety, big fruits, 13 oz. or more, and a pleasing combination of sweetness, flavor and very smooth texture. Plenty of vigor over a long harvest. Indeterminate
Oregon Spring	OP	D	60-70d	Sets fruit early even in cool climate. This determinate variety was developed at Oregon State University. Their research shows that Oregon Spring will produce incredibly early yields of tomatoes when planted outside a month before your last frost date if given some frost protection. Parthenocarpic, its earliest fruits are its largest and are mostly seedless.
Pink Berkeley Tie-Dyed	OP	I	65-75d	8-12 oz. fruits are dark pink with green striping, and the flesh is pink with yellow streaks. The flavor is outstanding - sweet and complex like the finest heirlooms. Compact Indeterminate.

Puck, Heirloom	OP	D	50-60d	Sets fruit early even in cool climate. Compact, a little over twelve inches in height on average and great for container growing. Produces 2-5 ounce, red, globes, good, mild, classic red-type flavor.
Siletz	OP	D	52d	Siletz is one of the most reliable tomatoes you can grow. Good eating fresh or paste making. The flavorful 4-5", deep red are nearly seedless (because they are parthenocarpic). Bred at Oregon State University especially for the PNWs cooler summers. Disease Resistance: F1, V.
Stupice, Heirloom	OP	I	52d (60-65)	The plants are relatively compact, only reaching a height of 3-4' but should be staked or caged. The 3-4 ounce fruits ripen early and are small, round, red, and have a tart flavor. Good eaten fresh or cooked.
Thornburn's Terra Cotta	H OP	Semi D	75d	Incredible flavor, color and history! Introduced in 1893 by James Thornburn of New York. With honey-brown skin, orange-pink flesh, and green seed mass, this is an eye-catching slicer with wonderful flavor
