<b>Amber, Russian Heirloom</b>	<b>OP</b>	<b>55-60d</b>	<b>D Dwarf</b>	<b>1-3 oz</b>
One of the earliest and tastiest tomatoes, with very compact and early plants, very good flavor. Amber is dwarf enough for container culture. Russian origin.				
<b>Beaver Lodge 6808</b>	<b>OP</b>	<b>55-60d</b>	<b>D</b>	<b>1½ -2"</b>
Early, productive, compact, and the plants tend to creep rather than grow tall and would be perfect in a hanging basket or patio container. Has a rich and balanced the flavor Bred at the Beaver Lodge Research Center in Alberta, Canada. 1 ½ inch round fruit.				
<b>Big Beef Hybrid</b>	<b>F1</b>	<b>73d</b>	<b>I</b>	<b>large</b>
Productive, the fruits have good shape, color, and old-time tomato flavor, too. These well-adapted, indeterminate plants are tolerant of, or resistant to: verticillium wilt, Fusarium wilt races 1 and 2, tobacco mosaic virus, root-knot nematodes, and Stemphylium (gray leaf spot). There's simply no better disease resistance package on the market today—and Big Beef has the All-America Selections Award to prove it!				
<b>Black Krim, Heirloom</b>	<b>OP</b>	<b>70-90d</b>	<b>I</b>	<b>10-12 oz</b>

Russian Heirloom. Indeterminate plants set generously sized, 2–3 inch, slightly squat, deep orange/red fruit with green-tinged shoulders, and bright red interiors with a rich, deep, balanced, sweet and tangy flavor. Territorial Seed Company's Great Northwest Tomato Taste-Off winner.				
<b>Dr. Wyche's Yellow, Heirloom</b>	<b>OP</b>	<b>75 d</b>	<b>I</b>	<b>10-16 oz</b>
Golden fruits with a meatier texture, richer flavor, and fewer blemishes than others in its class. Larger with a more flattened shape than Valencia at 10–16 oz. gorgeous fruits command attention at market, or on your BLT. Indeterminate.

Classic extra-early slicer. A longtime early favorite, Early Girl produces heavy yields of full-flavored, 4–6 oz. tomatoes. Also prized for its performance as a "dry-farmed" tomato, owing to its extreme tolerance to drought and blossom end rot. Disease Resistance: Fusarium Wilt races 1, 2 (High), Verticillium Wilt (High)				
<b>Early Girl, BUSH</b>	<b>F1</b>	<b>60 d</b>	<b>D</b>	<b>4-6 oz</b>
A compact bush version of Early Girl but even earlier, with bigger yields and larger, globe-shaped fruits. Height: 18 Inches, Fruit Weight: 5 - 7 Ounces, Fruit Size: 4 Inches. Resistant to: Fusarium Wilt (Races 1 & 2), Nematodes, Verticillium Wilt, Tobacco Mosaic Virus.				
<b>Goliath Giant Early Bush</b>	<b>F1</b>	<b>49 d</b>	<b>Semi-D</b>	<b>14-18 oz</b>
Large fruit on an early bush tomato plant. 'Giant Early Bush' is a week earlier than 'Early Girl' and as big as 'Big Beef' with an old fashioned tomato flavor that's both tart and tangy. Ideal for the garden or large pots. Requires support due to the weight of the fruits. Resistant to: Fusarium Wilt (Races 1 & 2), Nematodes, Verticillium Wilt.				
<b>Green Zebra</b>	<b>OP</b>	<b>72-75d</b>	<b>I</b>	<b>3-4 oz</b>
Green Zebra's sweet and zesty flavor is as appetizing as its appearance is spectacular. Always a ravishing table presentation, the 1 ½-2 ½ inch fruit have glowing green skin overlaid with olive and gold mottled streaks. Indeterminate plants just keep producing throughout the season.				
<b>Legend</b>	<b>OP</b>	<b>68 d</b>	<b>D</b>	<b>4"</b>
If late blight has been a problem in your garden, you should try growing Legend. Legend has shown some tolerance of late blight fungi. It is also one of the earliest maturing slicing tomatoes. Legend produces large quantities of meaty flavorful tomatoes with just the right amount of acidity. The big, 3–5 inch, parthenocarpic fruit are glossy red, with a uniform round shape. Bred and released by Dr. Jim Baggett at Oregon State University. Determinate. LB.				
<b>Momotaro</b>	<b>F1</b>	<b>70d</b>	<b>I</b>	<b>6-7 oz</b>
Momotaro is one of the most popular tomato varieties in Japanese markets and for good reason. Its flavor is an intricate and harmonious combination of sweet and tangy. The radiant pink slicers weigh 6–7 ounces. Momotaro is durable, heat tolerant, and crack resistant with good storability. HR: F 1–2, L, N, ToMV, V. IR: B.				
<b>New Girl</b>	<b>F1</b>	<b>62d</b>	<b>I</b>	<b>4-6 oz</b>
Early, great flavor. Fruits avg. 4–6 oz. and have better flavor and are more disease resistant than Early Girl. Widely adapted. Indeterminate. Disease Resistance: Fusarium Wilt races 1, 2 (High), Verticillium Wilt (High)

<b>Oregon Spring</b>	<b>OP</b>	<b>60-70d</b>	<b>D</b>	<b>4"</b>
Productive and early. This determinant(bush) variety was developed at Oregon State University. Their research shows that Oregon Spring will produce incredibly early yields of tomatoes when planted outside a month before your last frost date if given some frost protection. Parthenocarpic, its earliest fruits are its largest and are mostly seedless.				
<b>Pink Berkeley Tie-Dyed, Heirloom</b>	<b>OP</b>	<b>65-75d</b>	<b>I</b>	<b>8-12 oz</b>
Attractive, 8-12 oz. fruits are dark pink with green striping, and the flesh is pink with yellow streaks. The flavor is outstanding - sweet and complex like the finest heirlooms. Compact Indeterminate.				
<b>Puck</b>	<b>OP</b>	<b>50-60d</b>	<b>D</b>	<b>2-5 oz</b>
Sets fruit early even in cool climate. Compact, a little over twelve inches in height on average and great for container growing. Produces 2-5 ounce, red, globes, good, mild, classic red-type flavor.				
<b>Siletz</b>	<b>OP</b>	<b>52d</b>	<b>D</b>	<b>4-5"</b>
Siletz is one of the most reliable slicing tomatoes you can grow, even in cooler years it will produce an abundance of 4-5", deep red tomatoes before the end of the season. The flavor-packed red tomatoes are nearly seedless (because they are parthenocarpic). Bred by Dr. Jim Baggett of Oregon State University especially for the PNWs cooler summers. Disease Resistance: F1, V.				
<b>Stupice, Czech Heirloom</b>	<b>OP</b>	<b>52d (60-65)</b>	<b>I</b>	<b>2-5 oz</b>
Stupice is a popular, vigorous plant which yields abundant, early 3 to 6 ounce red fruit. The plants are relatively compact, only reaching a height of 3-4' but should be staked or caged. This Czechoslovakian-bred vine has exceptional flavor and ripens very early. Good fresh or cooked.				
<b>Thornburn's Terra Cotta, Heirloom</b>	<b>OP</b>	<b>75d</b>	<b>Semi D</b>	<b>large</b>
Incredible flavor, color and history! With honey-brown skin, orange-pink flesh, and green seed mass, this is an eye-catching slicer with wonderful flavor. The tomato produces heavily during mid-season and then drops off quickly once cool weather sets in. As a cooker it will yield a pumpkin-orange sauce with a floral aroma.

A longtime favorite heirloom plum. Does well in the PNW. Large for a sauce tomato, avg. 8-12 oz. with excellent flavor. These meaty tomatoes are good in salads and great for processing. Indeterminate.				
<b>Midnight Roma</b>	OP	80d	Semi-D	2"
With deep purple-red skin, Midnight Roma is a paste tomato packed with phytonutrients. In the kitchen, this purple wonder shines for its quick cook time and memorable flavor. 80 days to maturity. Semi-determinate. Purple color increases with direct sun; consider plant maintenance to increase exposure. Developed for the Pacific Northwest at Oregon State University.				
<b>Paisano</b>	F1	68d	D	4-5 oz
Johnny's Seed Exclusive! High-yielding bush San Marzano. Thick-walled 4–5 oz. fruits in the true San Marzano shape. Good flavor and high solids for sauce or canning. Concentrated sets of paste tomatoes midseason. Medium determinate plant.				
<b>Piennolo del Vesuvio, Heirloom</b>	OP	65d	I	small
This is an Italian heirloom tomato traditionally grown on the hillsides of Mt. Vesuvius. An indeterminate variety that is heavy, non-stop producing plant. A long keeping tomato, they can be used for snacking, salsa, fresh eating, salads, and sauces. This tomato is very flavorful, sweet and juicy with some citrus notes and a touch of acidity on the back end.				
<b>Bush Roma, Heirloom</b>	OP	77	D	3" L
An excellent heirloom tomato—firm, meaty, 3" oblong fruits with few seeds, on compact vines that are very productive. As a determinate type, most of the fruits ripen at the same time, which makes this tomato a good choice for canning, but tasty fresh in salsa, bruschetta, etc.				
<b>Bush Roma 'Ropreco' Heirloom</b>	OP	65d	D	2-3"
Productive and <b>early</b> , this heirloom Italian sauce tomato yields 2-3" red, plump 2-3 oz fruit that have a small point at the blossom end. Very good raw flavor. A good choice for short season or cool summer locations. Can out yield Roma, especially in cool summers. Shows resistance to Fusarium and blossom end rot.				
<b>San Marzano, Heirloom</b>	OP	80d	I	2-3"
San Marzano is considered one of the best paste tomatoes of all time, with Old World look and taste. Whole 4–6 oz. tomatoes peel easily and cook down quickly.				
<b>San Marzano II</b>	OP	78 d	I	2-3"
High-quality strain of this classic heirloom paste tomato. San Marzano is considered one of the best paste tomatoes of all time, with Old World look and taste. Whole 4–6 oz. tomatoes peel easily and cook down quickly. This strain originates from Parma, Italy, where it was developed for the 1950's canning industry. This strain has a very traditional San Marzano shape and appearance as well as a vibrant red color. Matures faster than many San Marzano strains. Indeterminate.

<b>Glacier, bush</b>	OP	55 days	D	1-2 oz
This very early tomato produces attractive orangey-red, 2 inch tomatoes. Surprisingly sweet for an ultra-early type. Determinate habit plant that is about 2 ½ feet tall, 3 ½ feet across, and quite open.				
<b>Juliet, grape tomato</b>	F1	60d	I	1.5-2.5 oz
Great flavor, fresh or cooked. Deep red, shiny fruits, productive, typically 12–18 fruits per cluster. Delicious, rich tomato flavor for salads, great salsa, and fresh pasta sauce. Good crack resistance, long vine storage, and shelf life. AAS winner. Indeterminate. Disease Resistance: Early Blight, Late Blight.				
<b>Supernova grape tomato</b>	OP	63	I	4-6 oz
Early and productive, Supernova impresses with both aesthetics and flavor. A yellow and red marbled mini-Roma shape, with red flesh with yellow marbling inside and out. Fruit has long shelf life.				
<b>Valentine, grape tomato</b>	F1	55	I	1 ½ " long x ¾"
Delicious high-lycopene grape tomato. Massive early yields, deep-red color, and unusually rich flavor. Long shelf life. AAS winner. NOTE: For best flavor, harvest when fruits are deep red.				
<b>Uralskiy Ranniy, Heirloom</b>	OP	50	D	
Unique, super early dwarf plants are very well-suited for container culture. Red, 2-4 oz, mini-beefsteak shaped fruit are juicy with good flavor. A Russian commercial variety, when translated means "Early from Ural."				
<b>Yellow Pear, Heirloom</b>	OP	75-80	I	1-2"
Very old tomato that dates to at least the early 1600's. 1-2 inch, pear-shaped, lemon to golden yellow fruits throughout the season. This variety was used by early Americans more for preserving and pickling. Yellow pear tomatoes are very popular today for salads.

<b>Gold Nugget</b>	OP	60	I	
An early, prolific, deep golden sweet yellow cherry tomato. Developed at Oregon State University for the cool climate of the PNW. Crack resistant.				
<b>Indigo Cherry Drops</b>	OP	71	I	
This stunning new cocktail cherry, with its excellent sweet flavor, may just be the best-tasting Indigo yet! Round, 1" fruits have indigo shoulders with rosy undersides and deep red flesh. Expect huge yields – potentially 500 to 1,000 fruits per plant under ideal growing conditions! Indeterminate. PVP(Plant Variety Protected)				
<b>Red Robin, Dwarf or micro</b>	F1	55 d	Dwarf	
This compact (height of only 6-12 inches) tomato variety is perfect for small gardens, containers, and even indoor growing! What sets Red Robin Tomato apart from other micro tomato varieties are two things: its exceptional flavor and prolific nature. It sets more fruit than leaves! Red Robin is the variety of tomato that is currently being grown on the International Space Station.				
<b>Sun Gold</b>	<b>F1</b>	<b>65 d</b>	<b>I</b>	
Fruity sweet or tropical flavor, bright apricot-orange round globes are about 1" across and are borne on long, 10–15 fruit, grape-like trusses. The vigorous indeterminate vines produce equally well in the field and the early spring greenhouse. F 1–2, TMV, V.				
<b>Super Sweet 100 Cherry</b>	F1	60 d	I	
Reliable red cherry with prolific yields of great tasting, ½ ¾ oz. fruits produced in large clusters. High Resistance: Fusarium and Verticillium Wilt.				
<b>Sweet Million Cherry</b>	F1	<b>65 d</b>	<b>I</b>	
1–1 ½ inch fruit in grape-like clusters. Red, Great flavor. High Resistance to F 1–2, TMV, ToMV 0–1.				
<b>Washington Cherry, Bush</b>	OP	60 d	D	
First early determinate deep-red cherry tomato. High yielding, compact plants. Globe-shaped, 1oz, 20–25 gm thick-walled, meaty, and flavorful, with good keeping quality. Developed by Washington State University.

Pale yellow fruits have a good, mild taste. Plants are compact and easy to pick but should be caged or staked.
